SERVICE TOPIC PREVIEW



March 7 – “With the Light of Science as Our Beacon” by Scott Prinster. Among our religious forebears we can count a number of scientists and, moreover, the views and values of science have informed Unitarian Universalist thought for ages. Why is it that scientific thought has found such a cordial welcome in Unitarian Universalism, and what compromises have we made to enjoy this harmony of science and spirituality?

March 14 -- “Responding to the Crisis of Catastrophic Climate Change” by Eric Hansen. Humans, both as individuals and societies, have confronted towering crises before. What lessons and hope can we draw from those experiences? How do humans perceive that a crisis is at hand – and an immediate change in course is wise? Author/activist Eric Hansen is an award-winning conservation essayist, lifelong Unitarian, and frequent pulpit guest.

March 21 -- “Healing” by Weeya Wakee Smith. When we think of being sick, we think of “getting better” which means to most of us, no longer feeling sick. We often take over the counter medicines and prescription drugs to feel better. But are there better more holistic alternatives? Join us for a discussion of healing from the Native American perspective.

March 28 -- “Will Science Still Have a Place among Unitarian Universalists?” by Rev. Scott Gerard Prinster. Looking forward, what is the future of scientific thought within Unitarian Universalism? Tensions have developed in our movement around the place of science as a privileged form of knowledge, and our congregations are no longer as strongly shaped by the humanisms so prominent decades ago. What will be asked of us in the future, and how may science help us respond?

April 4 -- Denise Jacobs, Margaret Krings, Geeta Bhojwani, Bruce Rose, Rick Adams, and Mike Wentz will share their experiences and learning as youth mentors in the 2009 Coming of Age program.

April 11-- “The Power of Words” by Lisa Vihos. Words are abstract constructs, black squiggles on a page, but they can pack a lot of punch. They can comfort, and they can hurt. Words are one thing on paper, and another thing when spoken. Words tell us the stories of our lives, they tell us who we are. Words can tell us about God; not definitively, but by pointing us toward God. Poet and teacher Lisa Vihos will share her personal journey with poetry and how words have the power to transform us.
